SICKNESS POLICY:

It seems like we are once again entering into flu season. We have added the sickness policy for your review as stated in the parent handbook. Please remember the parent handbook is located on our website under "Enrolment"

Building Blocks Childcare Centers takes precautions to provide a safe healthy environment for your child. Please help us keep your child home for at least 48 hours after the last symptom has occurred for the following:

He/she had a fever in the last 48 hours
He/she had diarrhea or vomiting in the last 48 hours
He/she has a cold with heavy nasal discharge or discharge that is colored
He/she has an unexplained cough

He/she is irritable and generally not his/her self He/she has symptoms of a communicable disease Has an unexplained rash

Has colored discharge in the corner of their eye

Please note that
it is Alberta Child and
Family Service's policy that
we require a doctor's note before
your child can come back to school
if you are called to come and pick up
your child for a cough or rash. This note
needs to state that your child is not
contagious and when your child can
come back to daycare.

Please note that we reserve the right to enforce a longer time period of exclusion over and above the doctor's recommendation if we feel your child still poses a health risk.

If your child becomes sick while at our center we will contact you to come pick up your child. If you cannot be reached we will notify the emergency contact person. The child will be kept comfortable and closely monitored until your child is picked up. Please be sure to sign the illness / incident forms upon pick-up.

Please inform us if your child has been exposed to a contagious disease so that we can notify the other parents and be alert to the first sign of illness. If your child contracts a contagious disease please notify us and consult your doctor as to when your child can return to daycare.

Please note that
Building Blocks Childcare
Centers excludes children for
lice, bed bugs, worms, pink eye and
chicken pox. If your child is sent home
with lice, the child will be excluded for 48
hours and must come to the office to be
checked before returning to class. For
chicken pox and bed bugs, a child may
return to the center after there is no fluid
present in any pox or bite and no new
ones have formed. Pink eye: a child
may not return to daycare for at
least 48 hours and no eye
discharge present.

Building Blocks Childcare Centres realizes that sometimes children will present with symptoms such as diarrhea and fever during teething and after immunizations however we still must treat these symptoms as being potentially contagious therefore your child will be still be excluded for a period of 48 hours.

HALLOWEEN PARTIES

will be held on Friday. October 31 st and will take place at 2:00pm for our Crescent Heights, Southlands and Southview daycare children. Please feel free to join us at school at that time. Children can come to school dressed up in their costumes in the morning or the teachers can help put them on after lunch. Sign up sheets for party food will be posted on the parent board or in your child's classroom for you to pick one or more of the edible snack items that are required for our party (siblings and grandparents are more than welcome to come as well).

These items include cheese strings, pretzels, uniced cupcakes, icing, Halloween sprinkles, cups, plates, popsicle sticks, and juice. Most of the snack items can be brought before the party day. During this time, you and your child will enjoy making and eating some spooky snacks. If you have any questions or concerns, please do nothesitate to talk to myself, Andrea Coulombe, or your child's teacher.

PARENTS GOING INTO CLASSROOMS:

While we understand that you would like to go into your child's classroom at drop off or pick up, we would strongly encourage you to please wait at the gate/door and drop off /pick up your child. There are many reasons for this including but not limited to mitigating the risk of spread of illness and emotional repercussions of your child or other children in the classroom.

Please remember to bring in an individual wallet size picture of your child as well as a family snapshot for our family quilt board.

Please remember to label all of your child's items including their backpack. This really makes things easier if items are labeled.

Please remember to bring a water bottle, which can be left in your child's back pack and used when needed.

Please remember to bring an extra change of clothes for your child.

Please be sure to initial and return your child's communication books because we cannot continue writing in them if your child does not bring it back to school.

Please make sure you are checking your child's backpack and parent board every day. On a regular basis items are placed in your child's back pack that are ready to be sent home. Also, important messages are posted on the parent board for you to read so please take the time to do so when you bring your child in.





Thank you for your patience and consistency with your children as they adjust to a new environment and routine. It does sometimes take a while for them to become comfortable with the whole school thing. You as a parent are doing the best thing for your child to continue to bring them on their scheduled school days as this helps them with the transition a lot faster. We hope that your child is enjoying school as much as we enjoy having them and watching them learn new things, especially our circle time songs. Sometimes it is hard for us to keep singing when these little ones are singing along!


1 PIECE OF WHITE PAPER

GREEN PAINT


WHAT YOU DO:
